Speaking of Festivals, each Chapter, especially those north of Fresno, should consider taking candidates to the beautiful outdoor setting near Mendocino, where Larry Tunzi allows the use of his ranch and amphitheater for conferral of the Chapter degrees. This year is especially significant, as this Festival at the ranch in Comptche (9 miles inland from Mendocino) is celebrating its  $40^{th}$  year! The theme is Forty For 40!! So if you have candidates for any or all of the Chapter Degrees, bring them to Comptche. Camping on the Ranch is at no cost! And there is a shack with men's and ladies' restrooms, and a co-ed shower. And of course a cook shack for preparation of the Friday night Fish Fry and the Saturday night Bar-be-Que. Nancy Hardiman will be planning a trip into Mendocino or Fort Bragg for shopping and lunch on Saturday, June 23<sup>rd</sup>, while we confer degrees. # THE MARK MASTER

The Mark Degree is important because it is the connecting link between operative and speculative Freemasonry. It is well known that operative stone masons indented the stones they had prepared with special marks. These were of two types, those that indicated the orientation and position of the stone within the building together with a personal mark to identify the mason who prepared it. This is a very old degree, with some indication that it existed in Scotland as early as 1599. What this ceremony consisted of no one knows. There may have been some moral teachings connected with it. The records however, merely show the payment of a fee and the registering of a Mark. Early evidence really only starts with documentation in the Craft Provincial Grand Lodge of Durham in England showing that it was being worked in the 1750's. The first available mention of English Mark activity in surviving minutes is recorded for 1st September 1769, by the Royal Arch Chapter of Friendship No. 3 meeting in Portsmouth, on the south coast of England. The next oldest minute referring directly to the Mark is in 1773 for the Marquis of Granby Craft Lodge No. 124, and then in 1777 for the St. Thomas' Lodge No. 142 in London. In Scotland the Dumfries Lodge (now Thistle Lodge No. 62) recorded in 1770 that the

Master elect was an Entered Apprentice, a Fellow Craft, a Master Mason and a Mark Master Mason. In Ireland there is a Mark Masons certificate dated 27th August 1775, issued by the Knights Templar of Kensale in County Cork. ....

The American Revolution, 1775 to 1783, historically proven to have had a strong Masonic influence, was to help lead American Masonry even further from the official English Modern's system. Of the 'Antient' type they diffused a liberal style of Masonry. By the end of the 18th century, for example, there was apparently no 'Modern' style of Masonry in North America. The early history of the Mark Degree in the United States is very similar to that in the other countries and is very meager. It was conferred in Lodges as part of the Lodge work as was the Most Excellent and the Royal Arch. Apparently Lodges worked the degrees as an inherent right and not under the authority of a charter. With the organization in 1797 of what eventually became known as the General Grand Chapter and with the forming of Grand Chapters, the degrees of Mark, Past, Most Excellent and Royal Arch came under the jurisdiction of Chapters operating independently of Symbolic Lodges.

The Mark Master Degree is based on the ceremony of registering a craftsman's mark in those years distinguished by operative craft masons and their temple building. Some scholars say it may be one of the earliest Masonic degrees. The Mark was and is directly associated with both Operative and Speculative Freemasonry and from time immemorial it has been the custom for the skilled craftsman to chisel his distinctive Mark on stones fashioned by him, so as to indicate his workmanship. The candidate for the Mark Master Degree represents a humble laborer in the quarries of King Solomon's Temple. Historically the degree illustrates the process by which the work on the temple accomplished by each craftsman was identified. ...

The Mark is a logical step from the Craft to the Royal Arch and enables the candidate to more fully appreciate the structure and beauty of Solomonic Masonry. Unlike all other degrees in Freemasonry, the Mark degree has only one emblem, the keystone, and the whole degree is woven around this symbol....

In England the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons was formed on 25 June 1856, and has its very own delightful headquarters situated a few doors away from St. James' Palace in London. The present Grand Master of the GLMMM is HRH Prince Michael of Kent, he is the blood brother of HRH Prince Edward, Duke of Kent, who is the Grand Master of the United Grand Lodge of England (UGLE) and also the First Grand Principal of the Supreme Grand Chapter of Arch Masons of England Royal (SGCE). Connections between the Royal Family and the English Royal Arch began in 1772 when, on 12 December, in the Grand Chapter acting as a private Chapter, HRH Henry Frederick, Duke of Cumberland (brother to King George III) was exalted. In 1774 he was elected Grand Patron of the Royal Arch.
